RIDDEN SCHEDULE

NB Ridden classes will commence at approximately 1 pm and will be arranged so that they do not clash if you enter more than one.

Classes 1,4,5,9,12,14,16,18 and 19 Miss C. Logan

Classes 2,3,6,7,8,10,11,13, 15 and 17 Miss J. Stokes

- 1 Best Turned Out Ridden. Plaiting optional. Any height.
- 2 Ridden Stallion, Mare or Gelding 4 years old & over not exceeding 13.2 hh (138 cms.)
- 3 Ridden Stallion, Mare or Gelding, 4 years old & over exceeding 13.2 hh (138 cms) but not exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms).

SPECIAL NO 1

1st and 2nd in classes 2 and 3 to compete for the 'Kingrick' Cup and Cup winner rosette.

- 4 Ridden Stallion and Gelding 4 years old and over exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms).
- 5 Ridden Mare 4 years old and over exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms).

NB Classes 4 and 5 will be amalgamated if insufficient entries.

SPECIAL NO 2

1st and 2nd in classes 4 and 5 to complete for the 'Reiss' Cup and Cup winners rosette.

- 6 Leading Rein. Mare or Gelding not exceeding 12.2 hh (128 cms) and riders not to have attained their 9th birthday by the day of the Show.

SPECIAL NO 3

The winner of class 6 to receive the Pine Ridge Cup and Cup Winner Rosette.

- 7 Western Pleasure. Stallion, Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over. Judged under the rules of the Western Equestrian Society. Special Award Rosette to best pony not exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms).

SPECIAL NO 4

Winner to receive the 'Zyda' Cup and Cup Winners Rosette.

- 8 Ridden Mountain & Moorland. Stallion, Mare or Gelding fully registered in Mountain & Moorland Stud Book or Part-Bred Register. Please state breed on entry form.
- 9 Side Saddle. Any height, 4 years old and over.

SPECIAL NO 5

Winner of class 9 to receive the 'Cream Silk' Memorial Trophy and Cup Winner Rosette.

- 10 Saddlebred and Quarter Horses. 4 years old and over. .
- 11 Family Horse/Pony. Any height. 4 years old and over suitable for any member of the family. Snaffle bits only.

SPECIAL NO 6

Winner to receive the James Logan Memorial Trophy.

- 12 Novice Stallion, Mare or Gelding never placed in the first three in a ridden showing class before close of entries. Snaffle bits only. Class will be split if entries warrant it.
- 13 Sport Horse 4 years old and over.
- 14 First-Time exhibitors. Open to animals owned by a BPS member exhibiting at the Championships for the first time.
- 15 Veteran Stallion, Mare or Gelding 15 years and over.
Oldest veteran to receive the Spirit of Gold Trophy
- 16 Riding Club Horse/Pony. 2 small jumps will be included.
- 17 Owner/Rider Any height ridden by owner.
- 18 Best Junior Rider – rider 16 years and under.
- 19 Pairs - any height – can be entered on the day.
- 20 Dressage – BD Introductory Test A (2008).
- 21 Dressage – Prelim 18.

SPECIAL NO 7

Winner to receive the JayCeeBee Dressage Trophy.

Special Award Rosettes will be awarded in classes 2 – 18, to the highest placed animal ridden by a Junior Member of the BPS. Those eligible please wear a white armband.

SPECIAL NO 8

1st and 2nd in classes 6-17 and winners of Specials 1 and 2 to compete for the 'Mary Pinsent' Trophy for the Champion Ridden Palomino.

22 Part-bred Arab. Open Stallion, Colt or Gelding.
Qualifier: Winner of Class 22 qualifies for Special 35.

23 Part-bred Arab. Open Mare of Filly.
Qualifier: Winner of Class 23 qualifies for Special 34.

Classes will be split if entrants warrant it. Entries must be registered with the AHS.

SPECIAL No 7

1st and 2nd winners in classes 22 and 23 to compete for the 'California' Cup.

Qualifier Winner and Reserve for Special 7 qualify for Special 38

24 Geldings, 1, 2 & 3 yrs old.
Qualifier: Winner of Class 24 qualifies for Special 33 – 'Astley' Trophy.

SPECIAL No 8

The 'Legend Moon Amber' trophy will be awarded to the best yearling.

25 Geldings, 4 yrs old and over.

SPECIAL No 9

1st and 2nd prizewinners in classes 24 and 25 to compete for the 'Shergolds Cup'

Qualifier: Winner of Shergold Cup qualifies for Special 36 or 37 depending on size.

Qualifier Winner and Reserve for Special 9 qualify for Special 38.

- 26 Owner-B red. 1 and 2 year olds, any height, owned by the breeder.
SPECIAL No 10
The 'Bletsoe' Cup will be awarded to the best yearling.
- 27 Owner-Bred. 3 years old and over, any height, owned by the breeder.
SPECIAL No 11
1st and 2nd winners in Classes 26 and 27 to compete for the 'Havenfields' Cup.
- 28 Not exceeding 12.2 hh (128 cms). Any age (yearlings, 2 and 3 yr olds must be calculated not to exceed 12.2 hh (128 cms) at maturity. See Rule 7.)
SPECIAL No 12
Winner of Class 28 to receive 'Goldenfields' Cup.
- 29 Exceeding 12.2 hh (128 cms) but not exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms). Any age. (Yearlings, 2 and 3 year olds must be calculated not to exceed 14.2 hh (148 cms) at maturity. See Rule 7).
SPECIAL No 13
Winner of Class 29 to receive 'Ridgemore' Cup.
- 30 Exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms). Any age.
SPECIAL No 14
Winner of Class 30 to receive the 'Roundhills' Cup.
- 31 Mountain and Moorland. Stallion, mare or gelding 3 years old or over. Fully registered in main body of any Mountain and Moorland Stud Book or the appendix thereof (excluding part-breds). Registration numbers and breed must be quoted on entry form.
Special Award Rosette will be awarded to the best Miniature Shetland.
Qualifier: Winner of class 31 qualifies for Special 36 or 37 depending on size and for Special 38.
- 32 Mountain and Moorland. Colt, filly or gelding, 1 or 2 years old. Fully registered in main body of any Mountain and Moorland Stud Book or the appendix thereof (excluding part-breds). Registration numbers and breed must be quoted on entry form.
Special Award Rosette will be awarded to the best Miniature Shetland.
Qualifier: Winner of class 32 qualifies for Special 33 and for Special 38
- NB If entries warrant it, classes 31 and 32 will be split into individual breeds.

SPECIAL No 15

The 'Treharne' Trophy to be awarded to be best fully registered Welsh exhibit (F.S.1 and F.S.2 not eligible) in classes 31 and 32.

SPECIAL No 16

The 'Ready Token' Cup to be awarded to the best Welsh Section A exhibited in Classes 31 and 32.

- 33 Part-bred Mountain and Moorland. Stallion, Mare or Gelding registered in any recognised part-bred Mountain & Moorland Stud Book. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.

SPECIAL NO 17

The 'Hunters Golden Sahara' Cup to be awarded to the winner of Class 33.

- 34 Stallion 4 years old and over, not exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms).

Qualifier: Winner of class 34 qualifies for Special 36 the 'de Beaumont' Cup.

SPECIAL NO 18

The best stallion not exceeding 12 2 hh (128 cm) to be awarded The 'Stargold' Cup.

- 35 Stallion 4 years old and over, over 14.2 hh (148 cms).

Qualifier: Winner of class 35 qualifies for Special 35 the 'Harry Hall' Trophy.

SPECIAL NO 19

1st and 2nd in classes 34 and 35 compete for the 'Bubbly' Cup.

Qualifier: Winner of this Cup qualifies for Special 35 'Shelsley' Cup.

- 36 Mare, 4 years old and over, without foal at foot, not exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms).

Qualifier: Winner of class 36 qualifies for Special 36 the 'de Beaumont' Cup.

- 37 Mare, 4 years old and over without foal at foot, over 14.2 hh (148 cms).

Qualifier: Winner of class 37 qualifies for Special 37 the 'Harry Hall' Trophy.

SPECIAL NO 20

1st and 2nd in classes 36 and 37 to compete for the 'Addison' Trophy.

Qualifier: Winner of this Cup qualifies for Special 34 'B.P.S' Cup.

- 38 Brood Mare not exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms) 4 years old and over WITH OWN FOAL AT FOOT. (Mares with non-palomino foals may compete).

Qualifier: Winner of class 38 qualifies for Special 36 the 'de Beaumont' Cup.

SPECIAL NO 21

The 'Shandiss' Cup to be awarded to the best brood mare not exceeding 12.2 hh (128 cms).

SPECIAL NO 22

The 'Miradore' Cup to be awarded to the best brood mare exceeding 12.2 hh (128 cms but not exceeding 13.2 hh (138 cms).

39 Brood Mare exceeding 14 2 hh (148 cms) 4 yrs old and over WITH OWN FOAL AT FOOT. (Mares with non- palomino foals may compete).

Qualifier: Winner of class 39 qualifies for Special 37 'Harry Hall' Trophy.

SPECIAL NO 23

1ST and 2nd in classes 38 and 39 to compete for the 'Shepley' Cup.

Qualifier: Winner of this Cup qualifies for Special 34 B.P.S. Cup.

40 Veteran Stallion, Mare or Gelding 15 years old and over. Commemorative Rosettes to all entries.

SPECIAL NO 24

The 'Pagoda' Cup to be awarded to winner of class 40.

41 Saddlebreds. In-hand. Open to pure and part-breds. Entries must be registered with a recognised Saddlebred Register. Special rosettes to be pure and best part-bred and best yearling.

SPECIAL NO 25

The winner of class 41 to receive the 'ASHA' Salver.

42 FIRST TIME EXHIBITORS. Open to animals of any height and age owned by a member of the BPS who is exhibiting at the Championships for the first time.

SPECIAL NO 26

The winner of class 42 to receive the 'Sameon' Salver.

43 Yearling Colt, Filly, or Gelding unlikely to exceed 14.2 hh (148 cms) at maturity. (see rule 7).

44 Yearling Colt, Filly, or Gelding likely to exceed 14.2 hh (148 cms) at maturity.

SPECIAL NO 27

Two highest placed fillies in classes 43 and 44 compete for the 'Monclare' Cup.

Qualifier: Winner of Cup qualifies for Special No 34 the 'B.P.S Cup.

SPECIAL NO 28

Two highest placed colts in classes 43 and 44 compete for the 'High Lees' Cup.

Qualifier: Winner of Cup qualifies for Special No 35 the 'Shelsley' Cup.

45 2 and 3 yr old, colt filly or gelding unlikely to exceed 14.2 hh (148 cms) at maturity. (See Rule 7). Special Award Rosette to best 2 year old if not winner, highest placed colt and highest placed filly.

46 2 and 3 yr old colt, filly or Gelding likely to exceed 14.2 hh (148 cms) at maturity. Special Award Rosette to best 2 year old if not winner, highest placed colt and highest placed filly.

Qualifier: Winners of Special Best Filly rosettes in classes 45 and 46 qualify for Special 34 'B.P.S. Cup. Winners of highest placed colt rosettes in classes 45 and 46 qualify for Special 35 'Shelsley' Cup.

SPECIAL NO 29

1st and 2nd in classes 43 and 45 to compete for the 'Holbrook Grange' Trophy for best youngstock unlikely to exceed 14. 2 hh (148 cms).

Qualifier: Winner of this Cup qualifies for Special 33 'Astley' Trophy. Winner also qualifies for Special 36 'de Beaumont' Cup.

SPECIAL NO 30

1st and 2nd in classes 46 and 48 to compete for the 'Durant Penmeric Gold' Trophy for best youngstock likely to exceed 14. 2 hh (148 cms).

Qualifier: Winner of this Cup qualifies for Special 33 'Astley' Trophy. Winner also qualifies for Special 37 'de Harry Hall ' Trophy.

47 Young Handlers. In-hand class for handlers 16 years and under on day of Show. Classes will be divided according to entries, which can be made on the day. Winner of this class to receive the 'Mills' Shield. Special rosette to youngest competitor.

48 Sire Produce Groups.

Conditions:

One group only per Sire. Groups of 3 or 4 Palominos only.

Foals not eligible.

All animals shown in Groups must be exhibited in their respective classes at the show.

Entry Fee £10 paid by Sire owner.

Sire owner shall have the right to bar entries. No exhibitor to form a group without the sire owner's consent.

Sires must be registered with the British Palomino Society.

Sires must be available for servicer in Great Britain and Eire.

Sires must still be alive.

PRIZES: Owner of Winning Sire – Broome Challenge Cup.

Owner of 2nd and 3rd Sire – rosette.

Owners of all stock exhibited in first 3 groups will receive rosettes.

SPECIAL NO 31

Best Turned Out handler and horse. A Special Rosette will be awarded in each of the In-hand classes to the best turned out handler and horse. All these winners will compete at the end of the day for a Challenge Shield.

SPECIAL NO 32

Colebridge Cup will be awarded to the animal gaining the highest number of points during the Show. Points will be awarded in all classes from 1st to 4th.

SPECIAL NO 33

Astley Trophy and Champion Rosette to best youngstock.

Qualifiers: Winners of Special 20 and Special 30 and winner of class 24 and 32.

SPECIAL NO 34

B.P.S. Cup and Cup winner rosette to the best mare of filly.

Qualifiers: Winners of Specials 20, 23, 27 and best filly rosettes in Classes 45 and 46 and winner of class 23.

SPECIAL NO 35

Shelsley Cup and Cup winner rosette to be the stallion or colt.

Qualifiers: Winners of Specials 19, 28 and best colt rosettes in Classes 45 and 46 and winner of class 22.

SPECIAL NO 36

'de Beaumont' Cup and Champion rosette to the best pony not exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms). (Youngstock must be calculated not to exceed 14.2 hh (148 cms).

Qualifiers: Winners of classes 34, 36 and 38, winner of Special 9 and class 31 if not exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms) and winner of Special 29.

SPECIAL NO 37

'Harry Hall' Trophy and Champion rosette to the best horse exceeding 14.2hh (148 cms).

Qualifiers: Winners of classes 35, 37 and 39, winner of Special 9 and class 31 if exceeding 14.2 hh (148 cms) and winner of Special 30.

SPECIAL NO 38

Bayliss Cup and Supreme Champion Rosette to be competed for by winners and reserves of Specials 7,9, 33, 34, 35, 36 and 37 and classes 31 and 32

SPECIAL NO 39

Lloyds Bank Trophy and Cup winner rosette to be awarded to the breeder of the Supreme Champion.

SPECIAL NO 40

Castle Gold Knight Cup and Reserve Supreme Champion Rosette to be awarded to the animal standing second to the winner of Special 38.

PALOMINO STALLION PROGENY POINTS CUP

Points will be awarded in all classes up to 4th place. The Palomino stallion gaining the highest number will receive a Cup. This will be presented at the AGM.

PALOMINO OF THE YEAR 2011/2012.

This will be run on the same lines as previously. Invitations and entry forms will be sent to those eligible.

INSPECTION

If your animal needs to be inspected, please enter in the show as RAF. Entry fees will be refunded should it not pass but it must be inspected before competing at the show.

PRIZE FUND

The cost of running this Show is considerable and sponsors are urgently needed. All contributors will be given a special badge to wear at the Show and their names will appear in the catalogue. You may simply make a donation, sponsor rosettes for a particular class or take advertising space in the catalogue. Advertisements cost £15 per page.

TIMETABLE

There will be two rings for In hand Palomino classes and two rings for Ridden. As far as possible, classes will be arranged not to clash. Ridden classes will probably be starting around 1 pm. In-Hand classes commence 9am.

CREMELLOS

The following classes for Cremellos will be judged on Saturday morning starting at approximately 10 am. Dressage will share the arena with ridden Palominos. Please use entry form in the centre of the schedule. Exhibitors need not be a member of the British Palomino Society.

Judge: Miss J. Stokes

CR1 In-hand 1, 2, and 3 year olds, any height. Special Rosette for best yearling.

CR2. In-hand, 4 years old and over. Any height.

CR3 Ridden Cremello, 4 years old and over. Class will be divided if sufficient entries.

CR4 Dressage – BD Introductory Test A (2008).

CR5 Dressage – Prelim 18.

Championship. 1st and 2nd prizewinners in classes CR1, CR2 and CR3 to compete for Cremello Championship and Cup.

RULES AND CONDITIONS

Please Note: In classes subject to height restrictions animals may be measured before the start of the class.

1. Exhibitors must be members of The British Palomino Society.
2. All exhibits must be registered, or accepted for registration in The British Palomino Society Register and entered in the name of the person recorded as the owner in the register.,
3. If the horse or pony has been leased by the person recorded as the owner in the register, it may be exhibited in accordance with Rule 2 by the lessee if written notice to this effect is lodged with the Society by the lessor.
4. Palominos must be shown with full manes and tails; plaiting (except in ridden classes), hogging or partial hogging will not be permitted. Any animal appearing in the Show Ring with a plaited mane or tail, or a hogged or partly hogged mane or tail will not be judged. Animals must also be in full coat, ie not clipped out.
5. Ages of all exhibits will date from January 1st.
6. All stallion and colts must be bitted. Yearlings only may be led on the nose band, with a bit in mouth. Foals must be lead. Any animal not sufficient under control may be asked to leave the showground.
7. In classes subject to height restriction the responsibility for entering animals in the correct class rests on the exhibitor who will, on no account, be allowed to transfer to another class. In classes 29,43 and 45yearlings should not exceed 13.3 (140 cms) on the day of the Show and 2 and 3 year olds 14 and 14.1 hh (142 and 148 cms) respectively. In class 28 yearlings should not exceed 11.3 (119cms) and 2 and 3 year olds 12 and 12.1 (122 and 124cms) respectively.
8. Brood Mares – no mare under four years old with foal at foot will be eligible for any class.
9. FOALS – no foal under one month old will be admitted to the Showground.
10. SOUNDNESS – all animals must be sound.
11. DISEASE – should any animal be found to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, it shall be removed from the Showground and Stables immediately at the request of the veterinary surgeon.
12. CANCELLATION OF CLASSES – any classes with insufficient entries may be cancelled, or, when suitable, amalgamated with another class. The judges are authorised to withhold any prizes, if, in their opinion, any exhibit does not merit an award.
13. CONDUCT. If the conduct of any exhibitor is such as shall in the opinion of the Committee be injurious to the character or interest of the Show, or shall an exhibitor cause cruelty or unnecessary suffering to, or neglect of, any animal, then the Committee may refuse their entry. The Committee shall have power, if any exhibitor shall in its opinion conduct themselves in an improper or offensive manner, to suspend them from membership, and or exhibiting, for such period as the Committee determines.
14. LOSS OR DAMAGE. The Committee shall not be liable for any claim in respect of any damage to any person, horse, or other person of any kind howsoever it may be caused. It is an express condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the Committee harmless, and that he or she shall indemnify the Committee against any legal proceedings, actions, expenses, costs, claims, demands or damages whatsoever arising from any accident or other incident which may occur.
15. PROTESTS. A protest may be lodged by any member and must be made in writing and given to the Secretary within one hour of the award or other matter to which exception has been taken. Objections will not be entertained from any person not exhibiting in the same class as the animal to which the objection is raised. The Secretary shall report to the Show Committee who shall, if possible, decide the case before the conclusion of the Show, otherwise it shall be referred to the Council.; The decision of either body shall be final. When an objection is heard, both the objector and the person objected to shall have notice. Any member lodging a protest shall deposit the sum of £20 with the Secretary and if, upon investigation, the protest is rejected, the sum thus deposited shall be forfeited. No members of the Council shall take part in the settlement of a disputed prize for which he is a competitor.
16. DOGS. Under no circumstances will dogs be allowed on the Showground unless on a lead at all times.
17. DOPING. In accordance with recommendations, outlined by the British Equestrian Federation, it brought to exhibitor's notice that no animal entered in classes at the Shows affiliated to Show and Breed Societies shall receive any drug which might offer an unfair advantage. Full details of these recommendations are available from the Show Secretary on request.
18. MOBILE PHONES. Any competitor using a mobile phone whilst they are competing in a class will be disqualified.
19. The judges decision is final.
20. Whips, only show canes 30" (76 cms) will be allowed. No schooling (dressage) whips. This applies to ridden and in-hand classes.
